

VI Prefectural Public High School Tuition and Other Fees and Educational Aid System

1 Regarding tuition fees, admission fees, entrance examination fees, and 1 device per person

Tuition and other fees for the 2025 school year are as follows. (Due to amendments to regulations, the amounts may be subject to change).

※Additional school fees (including costs for teaching materials like textbooks, PTA and other support organization fees, and school trip reserve funds) must be paid for separately in accordance with the regulations of each high school.

(Regarding 1 device per person)

Prefectural high schools have begun holding classes that use one internet-enabled device per student . These devices are used under a "BYOD (Bring Your Own Device)" policy where students use their own personally owned devices, so in principle each student will need to prepare a device of their own.

Some schools require specific device models. Each school will explain the details at the time of admission.

Rental devices can also be prepared, so please consult the individual school if one is necessary.

2 Educational aid system

(1) School attendance financial aid (related to tuition fees) system

Students enrolling in prefectural high schools after April 2014 whose parents' income is below a specified amount can apply to receive "school attendance financial aid" provided by the national government, and if approved, the parents will not be responsible for tuition fees.

Remarks	As of the 2025 school year, households with yearly incomes higher than approximately 9.1 million yen can receive the newly provided "Temporary Financial Aid for High School Students." Starting from the 2026 school year, an abolition of the income limit known as the "high school free tuition program" is currently being considered by the national government as a separate matter.
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(2) Scholarship Grant System

In order to reduce the burden of educational expenses for low income households, a grant-style scholarship that does not need to be repaid is provided. (The amount is adjusted every year. The amount for the 2025 school year is provided below).
